## **Primary Behaviour Checklist**

## **Guidelines for use**

It is intended that this checklist is completed by the classteacher to provide a focus for discussion with the Special Educational Needs Coordinator.

It is *not* appropriate to use as an observation of behaviour in the classroom situation.

Each item can be given a numerical score:

- No cause for concern (blank) as 0
- Moderate cause for concern as 1
- Serious cause for concern as 2

By adding all the 5 columns you will gain an Overall Total

This can be repeated at an appropriate time following intervention to compare with the initial checklist. This will give an objective indication as to whether or not the pupil is making some progress.
